Term 3 - How do we learn from people in the past?

Welcome back after the Christmas break. We hope you have had a lovely time with family and friends full of festivities. This term we are going to be finding out different ways we can learn about the past. We will be visiting Old Town Museum, having a historian guest speaker in and going on a local history walk in Old Town Gardens. In addition, we will be looking at old photographs and records from the past. We can't wait to find out more about your own families' history.

We are also really looking forward to seeing artefacts and photographs in addition to hearing stories and memories of your own family history. We will be looking at different sources such as diaries, letters, census results and more can give us an insight into the past and help us to find out about how they lived.

As before, homework and reading diaries will be given out on a Friday and returned on the following Wednesday to be checked. We still ask that children read at home 5 times a week and record this in their KS2 planner. We understand that children may not always wish to read their school books and would encourage them to explore a range of reading materials. These could include: fact files, magazines, newspapers, recipes, poetry, fiction and non-fiction texts. Children are also encouraged to practise their maths skills at home.

Our PE slots this term will continue to be on a Monday and Thursday. Please remember that it is a requirement for children to have a full school PE kit in school each day as things may change. We would like to remind you that all jewellery (except religious) must be removed for these sessions. If children cannot remove stud earrings they need to supply their own plasters for these sessions. In addition to our core curriculum we will continue to have clarinet and French lessons with specialist teachers to enrich our learning
