Children must be able to answer 25 random questions with 6 seconds per question.</p> <p>Column addition (up to thousands)</p> <p>Column subtraction (up to thousands)</p> <p>Column multiplication (up to thousands)</p> <p>Word problems using the above.</p>	<p>Handwriting</p> <p>Copy a paragraph from a current book using cursive handwriting.</p> <p>Practise ascenders and descenders in all letters where appropriate.</p> <p>Practise writing year 3 and 4 spelling words.</p>	<p>Writing</p> <p>Write a diary daily of what you did with your time while absent from school.</p> <p>Use the following:</p> <p>Fronted adverbials with commas</p> <p>Expanded noun phrases with prepositional phrases</p> <p>Plural apostrophes for possession</p> <p>Paragraphs</p> <p>Ellipsis</p> <p>Repetition for effect</p> <p>Metaphors</p>
